JESUS LOVES US, THIS WE KNOW, FOR THE BIBLE TELLS US SO



Remember the story of the prodigal son in Luke 15:11-32? Here's a summary from the NRSV, I adapted to refresh us:

A reflection from Pastor Althea as we head into the season of Lent

The Christian hymn "Jesus Loves Me" was first written to be a poem by Anna Bartlett Warner. Then it was adapted to be a hymn by William Batchelder Bradbury in the mid 1800's. We sing, "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so. Little ones

to Him belong. They are weak but He is strong." These words have stayed with many of us our whole lives. It is quite a simple song, and yet it has deep comfort for

us. God loves us dearly and Christ is our strength when we just cannot muster up the motivation, courage, or muscle to keep going.

As a social worker and a pastor, I have witnessed people actively dying in body, feeling like such a burden in their mind that they attempt to take their own life, and stray so far from their faith and spirituality that they forget God will never leave them or forsake them. These are extremes. Many of us struggle somewhere in between the extremes and tough stuff in our daily living. "Jesus Loves Me" reminds us that Christ is always with us and approaches us with love and mercy whether it is our body. mind, or spirit (sometimes even all three) which need healing.



Jesus continued: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So, he divided his property between them. "Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and there squandered his wealth in wild living. After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in

need... but no one gave him anything.

"When he came to his senses, he said, '...I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son...' So, he got up and went to his father. "But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him.

"The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' "But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him...Let's have a feast and celebrate. For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So, they began to celebrate...

Hopefully, most of us aren't struggling with the most extreme scenarios in our lives at present. Even if we are, God is with us as we navigate it. Wherever we exist as Lent begins this year, Jesus loves us and is strong when we feel weak. Lent is a time of reflecting and remembering that the Holy Trinity, Three-in-One, is always present with us to greet us, guide us, and love us. God rejoices when we remember who is most powerful. Almighty God, who created us and who created the world, holds us dear and greets us as we turn back to Him. Lent is full of repentance and repentance is "turning back". We are reminded to let go of the things which distract us from being close with God and the things which hold us back from being healthy humans in mind, body, and spirit.

I have created an opportunity for everyone to join me Wednesdays at 12:00 noon during Lent for a casual

Neal and Pastor explained that a small group of people are needed to sit down together and review this policy to find what items need to be removed or changed to better serve our church. The outline originated from the ELCA, but there are many items that do not pertain to our church.
- The Church Constitution and Bylaws must be updated this year. Our constitution is dated 2016 and it followed the format of Synod's constitution dated 2013. More discussion to follow.
- Installation of Church Council Members A date was set for Sunday March 16, 2025, during the worship service.

- **Social Ministry** to respond to the spiritual, mental and physical needs of our neighbors and advocate for the poor, hungry and vulnerable peoples of the world.




This snack's layers mimic properties of our planet's crust.

What you need:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup nut butter (divided)
- ½ cup chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Silicone mini baking cups


What you do:

- Combine the oats and ¼ cup of the nut butter. Mix until oats stick together.
- 2. Place 2 teaspoons of oat mixture in each baking cup. Press with a spoon. Freeze for 10 minutes.
- 3. Spread remaining nut butter atop the cups. Freeze for 10 more minutes.
- Microwave the chocolate chips 30 seconds. Stir and keep heating for 30-second intervals until melted.
- Spread melted chocolate atop the cups. Freeze until chocolate is firm.
- Remove from the molds and enjoy! Refrigerate leftovers in an airtight container.



Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - **white** = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - red = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver
