upcoming election. Fear and anxiety are everywhere whether we like or dislike possible candidates or whether we like or dislike their stances on significant issues.

I have listened to people who are on all sides of the issues, those who are conflicted, or feeling somewhere in the middle about topics which concern all of us. I have observed that many people care about our country deeply. Many people have similar concerns and feelings and yet our country seems to be divided more and

I never liked fire unless it was a good campfire on a crisp cool night. I believe I was a late teen before I even wanted to touch a match. In high school chemistry class, I made my best friend light our Bunsen burner during laboratory time.

Fire is not always a bad thing. Candles help us to see in the dark long before electricity was used in homes. Campfires keep us warm. Gas flames heat our food. Fire is how we light fireworks for patriotic celebrations like July 4<sup>th</sup>. God uses fire frequently throughout Biblical history to draw attention, speak to prophets, show His power, and to remind us God is watching over us all the time like in the passage above.

Several people have come to me in our congregation and in the public sphere mentioning mixed feelings about our

more. As Lutherans, we are overwhelmed with the cruelty and false accusations. A lot of what is going around doesn't seem Christian to us.

Then, we also have other events around the world and in our own lives. We don't like to see war occurring with Israel and terrorist groups. We have anxiety about our health, our families, and even the weather. It is hard to see the devastation from hurricane Helene. Society expects us to be held to a higher standard as Christians who believe in a Higher Power, and yet it can be easy to get caught up in the stress of the times.

I love our country. Elections are very important. We know it is setting the tone for the years ahead in Pennsylvania and the USA. Other current events matter too. Israel's relationship with other countries matters for many reasons. We know the weather is not completely predictable and nature can rip apart what humans build in minutes or hours.

Fire has the power to devastate us when it kills or burns people, possessions, or entire forests. Storms can overturn boats on the ocean, cause flooding on land, scare children or our pets. --So many things and so much stress!

God knows that we emotionally and spiritually walk through all kinds of fire which is not beneficial or good. The disciples experienced storms on the waters of the Sea of Galilee. Christ suffered all kinds of pain and betrayal prior to his sacrifice on the cross. We cannot always travel around the fire, or get ourselves "out" of a storm, but with so much scripture about fire, we know that God is with us when we walk **THROUGH** it.

God is all around us in the present and God will be with us in the future NO MATTER WHAT the outcome of the election. God is bigger than our country. God is bigger than Israel. Christ fought temptation, defeated death, and overcame the world. Jesus said, worrying about things won't add a single day to our lives (Matthew 6). God wishes us peace amidst a country which seems so divided and yet carries similar anxieties. God is still omnipotent when nations are at war. God is in the healing of the families and in the rebuilding of the places which were destroyed by Helene. God is with us as we navigate life and as we lift one another up in ministry and serving our community.

Faith is about trusting in the unseen. We cannot know the future and many of us wouldn't want to. We leave it to God. We leave the judging to God too. In Isaiah, we are reminded that God is Lord of all and knows all. In the Gospels, we hear stories of Christ carrying the disciples through storms.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, we are loved and we are called to find peace in our God who will never leave or forsake us. Jesus called Peter to take his hand on the water and have faith. Christ takes our hand too. God will lead us through the fire and the storms. Thanks be to God! Amen.

I am always around if you need to talk, to pray together, or just an ear to listen.

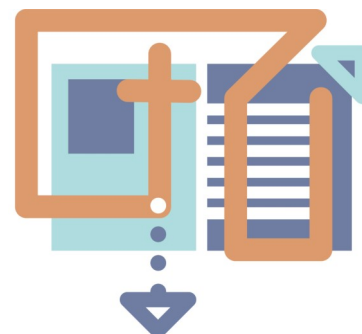

**Arn-Karrich: Harvest Home Service**  
**Sunday, October 13, 2024**

"A church celebration of gratitude for the year's harvest, still practiced among rural Pennsylvania Dutch congregations, during which the altar and sanctuary are adorned with samples of produce from the kitchen garden and farm fields and a special liturgical blessing and prayer of thanksgiving is offered. ## October 23 - Middle Creek: Not Just Snow Geese by Brant Porter

Look back and learn about Middle Creek's history over the last 50 years, and also discover what habitat improvements Middle Creek is making currently to benefit wildlife. Brant Porter is an Environmental Education Specialist for the Pennsylvania Game Commission's Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area. He has a degree in Biology from Penn State with a focus in Ecology and a Master's Degree in Forest Resources from the University of Arkansas at Monticello. Previously, Brant has been a Park Ranger for the US Army Corps of Engineers and a Forester for the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.















