






Highlights of Church Council Meeting, December 5, 2024

- The Expense side is right on budget at \$31,135.56. We had a few extra expenses come through including \$1800 for maintenance & repairs of the large refrigerator in the kitchen.
- Discussion followed on ideas of how to best address the need for more Stewardship to increase our income. We are very behind on our income side.
- There was discussion on the purchase of Spang Crest. In the beginning of 2025, Spang Crest will no longer be a non-profit organization. The money that our church gives to Spang Crest will be allocated to Luther Care starting in 2025. Money in the budget for this will also be redirected to Luther Care. Luther Care is a non-profit organization.
- The Mission Trip Committee has requested that the funds for them be moved to the church account instead of them having their own individual account. Renee Hunter will keep the books for this, but the money will go through the church.
- December 8, 2024, church service there will be a baptism – Isaiah Navarro.
- The Adult Sundy School class will be doing a study of Luther's Small Catechism beginning January 2025.
- Lebanon Conference Winter Assembly will be held at Zion Lutheran Church in Manheim on Feb 2, 2025, at 2:00pm. Snow date of Feb. 16, 2025.
- Lebanon Conference Spring Assembly will be held at Frieden's Lutheran Church in Myerstown on March 23, 2025, at 3:00pm.
- June 5, 6, 7, 2025 the Synod Assembly will be held in York. They will be voting for a new Bishop as Bishop Dunlop is retiring.

- Wednesday December 18, 2025, will be the Blue Christmas Service at 7:00pm. All are welcome! This service is quieter with focus on healing.
- JD Electric has completed the installation of all new lighting in the Sanctuary.
- There was a discussion on forming a personnel committee in the near future. Pastor would like 3 or 4 people total to serve.
- Two people are needed to attend this assembly.
 They will be voting for a new Bishop as well as a Synod Secretary, Treasurer and Synod Council.
 The assembly begins on Thursday evening and runs through Saturday until the voting is completed. There will be 2 conference meetings. Attendance for these are required. Pastor will make an announcement to the congregation for volunteers to attend the assembly.
- The Congregational Meeting for 2025 is scheduled for January 26, 2025, immediately following the church service in the Social Room.
- The next Council Meeting is scheduled for Thursday January 16, 2025, at 7:00pm.

January 22 -Woodland Vernal Ponds by Gene Wingert

Woodland Vernal Ponds are found throughout Pennsylvania's woodlands. They are an integral part of the forest community. These diminutive wetlands typically fill with water during the Fall and dry in late Spring or early Summer. The organisms that breed in these ponds are an integral part of the forest ecosystem. Because these ponds dry during summer months, predators of permanent water are not present and the recruitment of many of the obligate species is often near 100%. The amphibians that breed in these wetlands comprise the greatest biomass of vertebrates in the forest ecosystem. This program will follow the ecology of a vernal pond through a single year from Summer to Summer and investigate the various migrations and breeding behaviors of amphibians that utilize these wetlands.

Dickinson College biology instructor Gene Wingert's career highlights include teaching Biology and Biochemistry at Cumberland Valley High School, Harrisburg Area Community College, and Dickinson College where he has taught since 1991.

Aluminum Can Collection


The church continues to collect aluminum cans for recycling. Please bring the aluminum cans (rinsed & flattened) to the church weekdays during church




